## Bormio & Malta-

Pac Rim's 2005 European trip will be to Bormio, Italy with an extension to Malta. Lots has been happening and there are some changes, including a price reduction.

We have booked the 4-star Hotel Rezia in Bormio close to the ski area and the old-town. Bormio is skiable at just over 3,000 m [almost 10,000 feet] from convenient lifts operating near our hotel. The hotel provides van service to these slopes.

A must do is the "Bagni Vecchi" [Old Baths], one of the two thermal centers of Bormio. These therapeutic waters come from nine different springs with a temperature of 98.6° - 105.8° F.

In Malta, we will be staying at the 4-star Golden Tulip Vivaldi Hotel in St. Julians. This four star hotel is located in the entertainment district of Paceville in the north of Malta. It is a newly built hotel which combines the local flavor of the Mediterranean with international standards. The hotel is just 2 blocks from the sea, 1.9 miles from Sliema, 4.3 miles from Valletta the capital of the island, and 6.2 miles from the airport.

To top it off, on our return we will overnight in Rome at the 4-star Hotel Capo D'Africa, just minutes from the Coliseum. We'll have most of one day to explore Rome. [See page 7]



# Two Outstanding Ski Weeks-

Pac Rim will be joining LA Council February 5-12, 2005 for a trip to Steamboat and FWSA for a trip to Snowmass January 29 February 5, 2005. We are offering these trips separately or as one.

While most of our air will be out of LAX, we will have air out of San Diego, Las Vegas and other airports. We need for you to sign up now so we can lock in the air for airports other than LAX.

Our lodging for **both** resorts is **Ski-In** / **Ski-Out** with the Aspen package being \$849 [plus air and ground transfer]. At Steamboat, we have two properties to choose from, Thunderhead at \$899 + air and the very upscale Torian Plum for \$1149 + air. All property we have chosen are 2 bedroom/2 bath condos.

The air & ground transfers for both Aspen and Steamboat range from \$439 out of LAX to \$499 out of San Diego. For both airports we will be flying into Eagle, bus to Aspen, bus to Steamboat, bus to Hayden, fly home. Both flights are on United through Denver. [See page 8]

# FITNESS & SAFETY - COOLING DOWN

Cooling down after a work out is important to prevent injuries. While cooling down, you can add a little more general body & core strength to the workout by alternating different exercises. Move from one exercise to the next without resting to continue the aerobic benefits.

### Sit Downs—

Work by starting in a sit up position and doing a reverse crunch or sit down. Do 2 sets of 10-20 repetitions.

## Calf Raises—

Calf raises work all lower leg muscles. Raise up slowly, hold for 2 seconds,

and lower slowly. Try for 2 sets of 10-20 repetitions.

# Push-Ups—

Push-ups improve the strength of the chest muscles and shoulder stabilizers. Do one set of push-ups in each of three different hand positions: hands narrow [thumbs touching], hands shoulder width and wide. When starting out try doing them in a kneeling

position or against a table making the resistance a little less. Do 2-3 sets of 10-15 repetitions.



## • Hip Bridges—

Lying on your back with knees bent to 90 degrees, bridge hips up in the air and hold for 4 seconds. Do 2-3 sets of 10-15 repetitions. When your core strength improves add a 1/4 twist at the top.

# Moonlight Basin Expands—

Moonlight Basin will expand its boundaries for the 2004-2005 ski season. The resort is adding a new quad chairlift, allowing it to provide lift-served access to terrain previously accessible only by snow cat.

At least twenty new lift-served trails will be added. Inbounds hike-to terrain will also be expanded, increasing the resort's total vertical drop to 3,850'— one of the largest inbounds vertical drops in the United States.



Lift-served vertical will increase from 1,850 feet to 2,030 feet. Skiable acreage within the resort boundaries will increase from its current 1,500 acres to more than 2,000 acres.

## Mammoth Mountain-

The National Off-Road Bicycling Association [NORBA] is returning to Mammoth for the 2004 US Mountain Bike National Championship September 23-26, 2004. Some of the most incredible mountain bikers in America will descend on Mammoth Mountain for the national championship event.

Slated to take place at Mammoth Mountain's Main Lodge, the three days of competition will feature over 2,000 riders competing in various categories. Riders must qualify in order to compete for the national championship titles in Cross Country, Short Track, Downhill and Mountain Cross.

# New Snowmass Base Village Approved—

Chalk up a victory for **Jim Crown**, the once-shy lead family owner at Aspen Skiing Company. His outspoken lobbying on behalf of the proposed new development of Snowmass Village undoubtedly was a factor in the 5-0 thumbs-up vote that Snowmass's town council gave to the Base Village project August 26, 2004.

The current plan will create a \$400-million core village, hotels, underground parking, retail, and a gondola in the resort nine miles from Aspen, in partnership with Intrawest.

# Intrawest Deals at Copper & Winter Park—

Copper Mountain's Four Pass is selling for \$69 this year, down \$20 from last season, while Winter Park's Four Pass is selling for \$89, down \$10. These price reductions offer Front Range skiers and snowboarders the opportunity to hit the slopes for as little as \$18 per day at Copper and \$23 per day at Winter Park.

New this winter, Breeze/Max, Copper and Winter Park will offer a variety of rental passes and an equipment lease program to give skiers and riders a convenient opportunity to check out the latest winter equipment. For \$249 you get the Demo Rental Pass which is a non-transferable rental pass that can be used daily, all season long, to rent the latest, top-of-the-line skis and snowboards. For \$299 you get the Rocky Mountain Ski Lease with an option to lease top-of-the-line skis throughout the season with four opportunities to swap equipment.

## Alta-

Alta finally has a bottom-to-top lift— the new Collins Lift is a 6,300-foot long detachable quad replacing the old Collins and Germania lifts. Skiers will ride one lift to the top in under nine minutes, accessing over 1,800 vertical feet of skiing.

# Backcountry Safety-

Here are some key safety tips for riding in the backcountry.

- Most avalanches start on slopes that are 30° or greater.
- Avalanche danger is greatest during and shortly after intensive snow falls [one inch or more of snow fall per hour].
- Stay off leeward slopes during periods of strong winds where blowing snow can create the same unsafe conditions as intensive snow fall.
- Cold weather followed by a sudden warming trend [or rain on the snow pack] can be a dangerous time in the mountains.
- Trees spaced more than 3 yards apart do NOT provide any more protection than open slopes.
- Use ridge lines, heavy tightly-spaced trees, windward sides or low angle slopes [less than 30°] to minimize your exposure.
- When crossing suspected avalanche slopes, do so one person at a time. But remember that just because one or more individuals have crossed a slope does not mean that the slope is safe.
- Stay out of gullies. They are natural pathways for avalanches and often fill deeply with snow when an avalanche occurs.
- Check the avalanche forecast before leaving for the backcountry.
- Never travel the backcountry alone. It's best to go with two or three buddies.
- Always carry emergency avalanche equipment— transceiver, portable shovels, probe poles-and for a hasty snow pit: hand lens, pencil, knife, and compass with inclinometer. At the beginning of each winter season practice with your transceiver. Know how to use it before you need to use it.



# KID'S KORNER

# 4 kids & grandkids

Today kids aged 4 to 16 represent 15% of total skier and rider visits in the U.S. By the year 2018, there will be a 4% decline of white kids under the age of 20, and a 23% increase of the ethnic minority population under the age of 20. Understanding who they are, what they want and how to make them stick around is important to the future of snowsports.

# The Research Study-

Researchers asked 450 kids from across the country a number of questions relating to their current levels of participation in skiing or snowboarding. The kids were asked about their experiences during their most recent visit, what they liked and disliked about skiing or riding, and what leisure activities tend to draw them away from snowsports. The following provides a few brief highlights of the research.

## The Basics-

82% of the kids own their own equipment— 92% of the older kids already had their own gear while only 69% of younger kids did. The study also showed that 59% of the kids took a lesson their first time out.

While 90% of the kids entered the sport on skis, over time a large number switched to snowboarding. By age 14 almost 50% were boarders.

Many of the kids said that they preferred learning from family or friends. Kids 12 years old and under were especially inclined to prefer learning from their parents.

When asked why they are still involved with downhill snowsports, younger kids' comments support the strong influence of family. As they get older their support structure evolves and kids tend to focus more on peer connections.

# Fun is the Key-

For kids of all ages the fun factor was of paramount importance in their decision to continue with the sport. Kids are significantly more interested in the speed and thrills of the sport than adults, and are also interested in the sport as a way to spend time with their family.

Other activities are significant competitors for skiing and snowboarding. Clearly soccer represents a significant interest for the kids.

# Kid Demographics-

Overall participants were broadly distributed geographically, but not surprisingly, they tended to cluster in key skier/boarder markets. In 2004, kids aged four through 16 made up for about 12% of the total number of skiers and boarders, while four to 16 year olds made up about 20% of the total U.S.

population. To keep skiing / boarding growing, this performance gap needs to be closed by turning young people who try the sport into core skiers and riders.

There is a limited time window for achieving these goals. Population projections from the U.S. Census Bureau indicate that over the next 15 years, the youth market will evolve substantially. The total size of the four to 16 year old age group will increase by about 4.5%.

## Kid Growth-

Growth in this age segment is largely driven by a 22% increase in the ethnic population, combined with a

6% decline in the white population. There is significant urgency in reaching out to the existing youth market, while at the same time reconfiguring future marketing strategies to capitalize on a more diverse youth market.

Ski clubs can learn from these statistics if we too want to survive.











## Why Bormio-

Bormio's origins are linked to its thermal waters, which have been renowned for their curative powers since ancient times. The nine springs are mentioned in Roman documents dating back to the first century AD. Today the tradition continues in modern thermal baths, most notable being the Bagni Vecchi baths.

The resort's long history has given it a rich collection of architectural treasures which make it a very interesting place to stay. Centered around the busy Via Roma, Bormio's old buildings are decorated with frescoes. It is here in the old town where you will get a taste of true Italian life, especially in the evenings. Here, a maze of small lanes zig and zag in all directions where you can shop 'til you drop.

Bormio's 5,879' vertical drop is one of the longest in Italy. Bormio at 10,000' is not a vast inter-linked skiing domain, however it's a great place for those who love to get to the top of the mountain and cruise descents of up to 9 miles down to the resort. The lower two thirds of the slopes are forested and serviced by snow making. Bormio, chosen to host the 2005 World Cup Championships, is part of the Alta Valtellina Lift Pass system with access to the slopes of Livigno, Santa Caterina and San Colombano.

Trip price is based on an exchange rate of 0.81. Also for the first time, we can offer air from San Diego and Las Vegas for an additional \$68. A superior room at the Hotel Rezia is an additional \$70.
